

So, what's the big deal about Easter?

Remind me: what is it we're celebrating again?

"Unlike Christmas, Easter doesn't have a crazed shopping season preceding it. It doesn't have its own tree. It doesn't spawn wild office parties. It doesn't boast its own annual TV specials for kids. It doesn't spawn new albums from pop stars. It doesn't prompt people to send out boatloads of cards to friends they haven't seen all year. It doesn't have its own sweaters. It isn't the date that many children (and adults) anticipate all year. It doesn't have dozens of songs beloved by even those who don't celebrate the holiday. It doesn't even have its own set date.

But in the eyes of most Christians, Easter is a more important holiday than Christmas."

To the non-Christian world, Easter is not as big a deal as Christmas. It's mostly just an excuse to look at cute chicks and bunnies and eat some chocolate. However, for Christians it marks the single most important event in history.

Christmas is a big deal, because it commemorates the incarnation – God becoming flesh and dwelling among us. Yet Easter commemorates the resurrection of Jesus after his death on the cross. Through his death and resurrection we are redeemed from our sins and put in a right relationship with God. This means we will experience a resurrection as well and are given eternal life with him in a restored creation when He comes again.

So, what is the big deal about that? Basically, through our relationship with Jesus Christ, we are in a relationship with God himself – the One who created us and knows us more than we know ourselves. By following the teachings of Christ and his example, we live our lives in the way we were created to live. The blessings that come from that life are abundant.

Though you may not hear Easter hymns on the radio as you do Christmas carols, there are some really great songs and hymns that celebrate the resurrection of Christ and our resurrected life.

I invite you to join with the family here at Oakville Church in experiencing that abundant life that Christ offers us, and all the blessings that flow from that.
